In the 2012-2013 school year, Sisters Elementary School earned an overall school rating of level four out of a possible five. The rating components combine achievement, growth, and subgroup growth into a complex formula that compares our school to all schools statewide. This means our students overall are outperforming those at like-schools.

Over the course of this next year we will continue work on our instructional delivery as we implement Common Core State Standards, as well as continue our work with a standards based report card and proficiency grading. We look forward to the challenges ahead and continually serving our students and community!

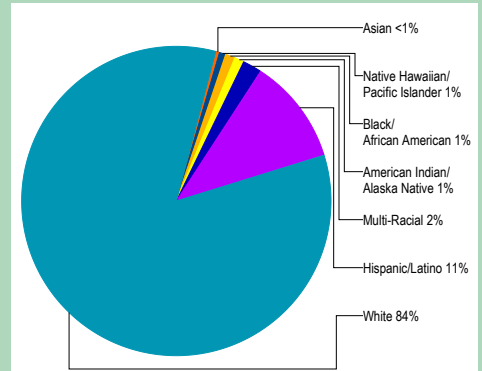

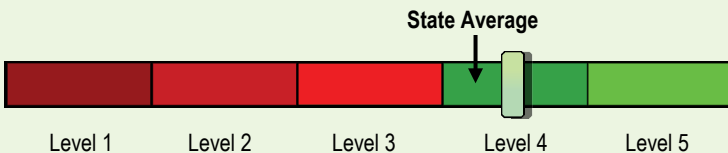

The overall state rating is intended to summarize this school's particular successes and challenges. It is based on a combination of up to five factors. Three of these factors come from standardized test scores in reading and math: student achievement, student growth, and the growth of underserved subgroups. Please be aware that this rating is based mainly on high-stakes testing and accordingly, represents a limited view of student performance. Other aspects of this report card are designed to put this rating in the proper context.

Compared to all schools statewide in 2012-13, this school is rated as Level 4.



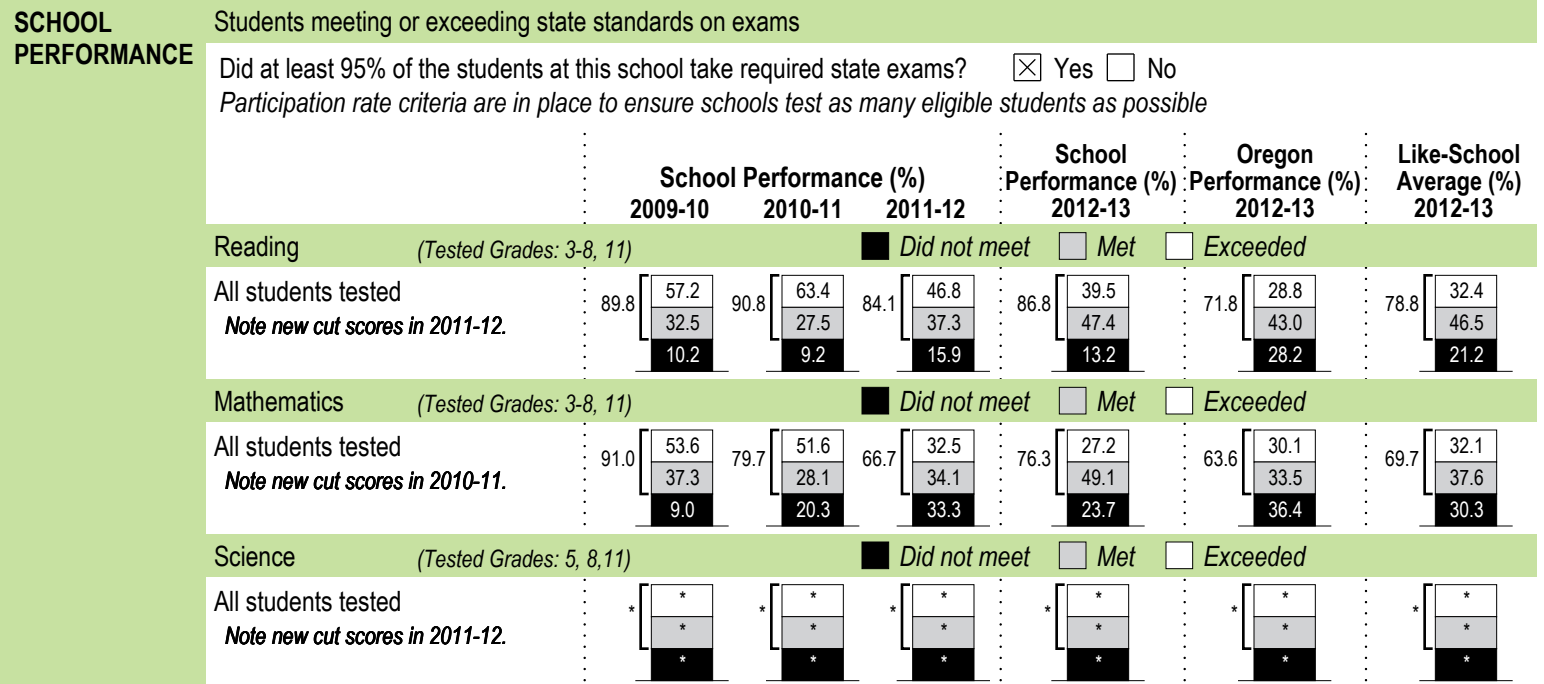
- Level 1** = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools

- Level 4** = Falls between 44% and 90% of schools
