Dear Sisters Schools Community,

Again, we appreciate your patience and understanding as we have navigated this complicated COVID-19 situation. The district has been following guidance from Governor Brown and the Oregon Health Authority to keep our community as safe as possible.

We hope the current plan stifles the spread, and we are able to come back to school on April 6th. This full 21 days off gives us time to deep clean our schools and prepare for the safe return of our students and staff.

We want to let you know that as of yesterday, none of the positive cases of COVID-19 in Deschutes County, or the state, had a connection to the Sisters School community. I know that steps to prevent community spread continue to have an impact on our daily lives. Although it is not a popular stance in our house, please remember that “play dates” or other social gatherings can lead to community spread and should be limited as much as possible.

If school cancellations extend beyond April 6th, our plan is to have staff meet in grade level and content teams to push out core distance learning materials to our students.

Please accept my sincere thanks for your patience and support as this situation has continued to evolve in Oregon and across the country. Again, these measures are intended to help protect the most vulnerable populations we serve and to safeguard students, employees and the community as much as possible.

Sisters School District is currently supporting students with grab-and-go breakfast and lunches that can be picked up at Sisters Elementary School. Breakfast is available between 8:00am and 8:30am while lunch can be picked up from 11:30am - 12noon.

Again, at this time, all athletics and activities, contests and practices will be canceled in the near future.

Thank you again for your continued support as we navigate this rapidly changing crisis.
