Although most of my communications have been very focused on our Distance Learning efforts and response to the COVID-19 crisis, I want to give an update from our last school board meeting as well.

We grew by eight students as reported in the April board meeting. Bond work continues as our new Transportation Center construction moves forward and the walls are starting to go up. Additionally, the board approved the 2020-2021 School Calendar with some modifications. As soon as those modifications are made, we will post the School Calendar on the district webpage and send it out.

The district submitted the Student Investment Account application to the Oregon Department of Education and we had our first official budget meeting. With the uncertainty of the economic impact of the COVID-19 crisis, the Sisters School District is especially grateful for our communities continued support of our local option.

Sisters School District is still supporting students with grab-and-go breakfast and lunches that can be picked up at Sisters Elementary School. We are now serving both breakfast and lunch from 10:30 - 11:30 am daily. We will be sending out information next week as we look at supporting our students with some community drop-off points for food and other educational needs.

Again, I remind you to take the time to take care of yourselves and those that you love. We have an incredibly strong community and together we will continue to navigate the challenges that this crisis presents.
