Dear Sisters Schools Community,

We have been excited about serving our K-3 students in-person for the past month, and it looks as though the state is changing the metrics to allow the opportunity for more in-person instruction.

Today, Governor Brown had a press conference to announce new metrics and guidance for schools. These metrics will give schools and communities a better pathway to reopen and serve students in some type of in-person instruction. As we digest these new metrics, we will communicate out how these changes will impact Sisters School District, and our ability to serve our students and families.

Currently, state-wide, we are serving less than 10% of our students in any type of in-person instruction. In Sisters School District, with the K-3 exception and those students that are being served in some form of limited in-person instruction, we are serving between 30-40% of our students weekly.

These changing metrics do not diminish our continued need for vigilance around COVID-19 protocol. Please continue to follow the physical-distancing, hand-washing, and mask-wearing protocols that have been put into place to stop the spread of this virus. Even with the new metrics, continued spikes in Deschutes County will limit our ability to serve our students.

I want to continue to encourage you to openly communicate with your teachers and building staff when questions or concerns arise, both academic and social / emotional. Our staff are here to help support you through these times.

Again, I remind you to take the time to take care of yourselves and those that you love.
